<p>1. Master's program students in this department are required to complete at least 32 credits of required and elective courses with passing grades, to pass all examinations stipulated in the University's Regulations Governing Graduate Degree Examinations, and to fulfill the department's required Basic Professional Competency Assessment, in order to be eligible for graduation.</p> <p>2. Students who wish to take courses offered by other departments or graduate institutes must obtain the signed approval of the Department Chair, with a maximum of 6 credits allowed.</p> <p>3. The elective courses listed in this required and elective course curriculum table are retroactively applicable to students admitted prior to Academic Year 114.</p> <p>4. Prior to applying for the thesis proposal oral examination, students must have completed the requirements stipulated in the University's Guidelines for the Implementation of Academic Ethics Education.</p> <p>5. In accordance with the University Academic Regulations, master's students must meet the requirements specified in the Regulations for the Implementation of English Proficiency Assessment in order to graduate. With the exception of students from the International College and the Department of Applied English, all master's students who have not met the English proficiency standards set forth in the Ming Chuan University Regulations for the Implementation of English Proficiency Assessment prior to graduation are required to complete one elective course, chosen from English Presentations, Social English, Business English, or Intercultural English. Upon successful completion of the selected course, the student shall be deemed to have satisfied the English proficiency requirement.</p>
